



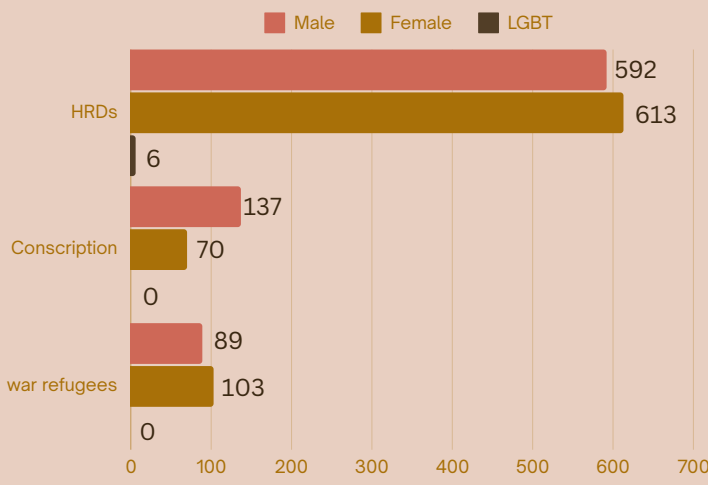
Program Overview

The NMF strives to offer humanitarian support to human rights advocates, democracy supporters, refugees, and marginalized communities inside and outside of the country. The efforts encompass supplying resources like food, shelter, financial aid, and medical care, alongside providing vocational and language training programs. Additionally, the NMF aids Burmese migrant communities by partnering with various stakeholders in Mae Sot. **This newsletter highlights the overall activities undertaken during May 2024.**

HIGHLIGHTS

- NMF made an action calls on 11th and 13th May 2024 to the international community on massacres in Myin Mu and Saw townships.
- A total of 22 people, including 13 females, 8 males and 1 LGBT individual were job facilitated in sewing factory.
- 2023 Annual Report of “Human Rights Violations in Myanmar” was launched online on 13th and 14th May with the participation of 19 local organizations and 17 international organizations as an advocacy effort to global and local communities.
- Human Rights program posted a statement on World Press Freedom Day on 3rd May calling for press freedom and the release of detained journalists.

BASIC FOOD SUPPORT PROGRAM Total Beneficiaries 1842



In May, NMF provided basic food cash support to a total of 1842 people including 1211 HRDs (592 males, 613 females and 6 LGBT), 207 draft dodgers (137 males and 70 females) and 192 war refugees (89 males and 250 females). Since February 2022, it has provided food of 28,412 units (One-month units) to 16,546 individuals.

SAFEHOUSE PROGRAM Total Beneficiaries 189



NMF provided to 189 people with shelter. With the support of Japan Platform, NMF has been working together with CWS on this program. Since the start of the program in September 2021, NMF’s safe houses program contributed to a total of 1,991 individuals with shelter assistance. This program also supports job facilitation, health insurance, medical service, vocational training, educational support and discharge support to the residents.

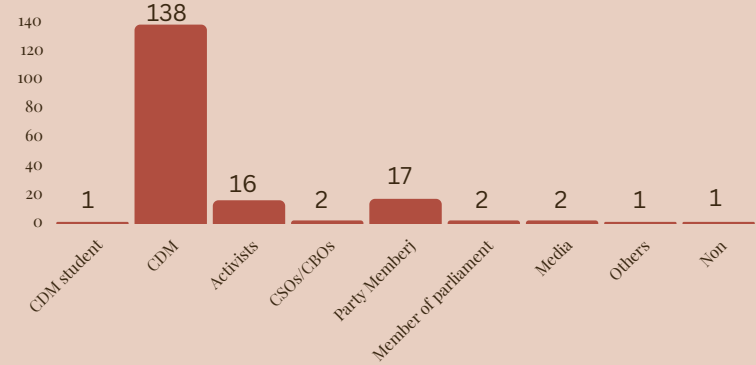
BASIC MOTOR SEWING MACHINE TRAINING Total Beneficiaries 18

In May, industrial sewing training batch-38 was completed producing 20 trainees. Another ongoing training batch-39 was delivered to 18 female trainees. Until now, there are a total of 39 sewing machine trainings with 389 trainees where 289 got jobs.

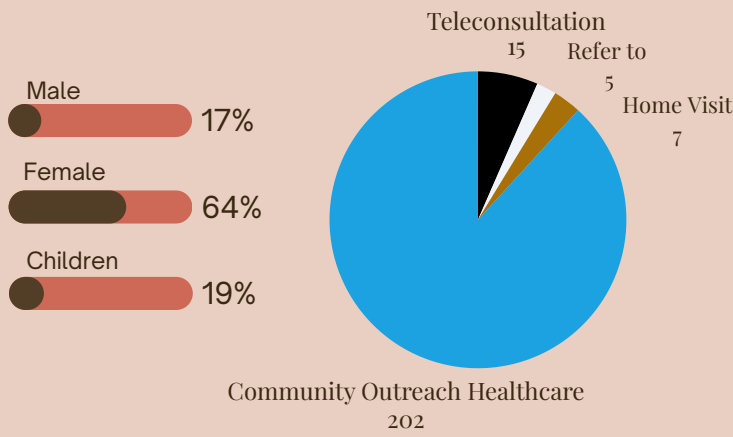


INSIDE BURMA SUPPORT PROGRAM Total Beneficiaries 180

NMF provided financial aids for three months to 180 HRDs (60 males and 120 females) in Myanmar as part of a six-month project. Moreover, socio-economic survey was conducted amongst the beneficiaries and the report will develop in June 2024. Since 2021, the program has aided 6,358 individuals, including HRDs, political detainees, and internally displaced persons.



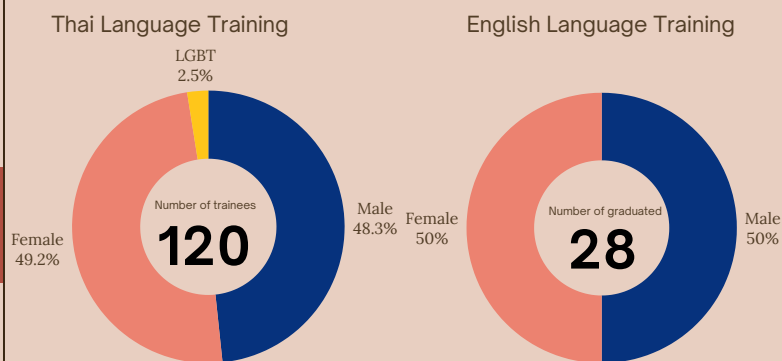
TELEHEALTH PROGRAM Total Beneficiaries 229



The program treated to 229 patients in May 2024. Since the start, NMF’s telehealth program has provided free healthcare services to 2,560 Burmese in Mae Sot, which cover 753 males (29%), 1442 females (56%) and 365 children (16%).

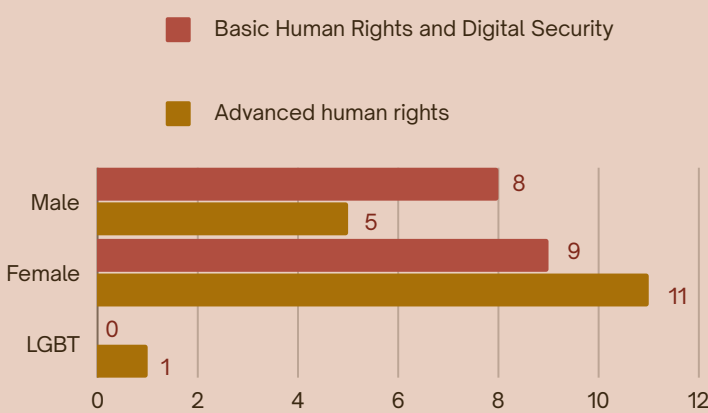
LANGUAGE TRAINING PROGRAM Total Beneficiaries 148

Since the start of the NMF’s language training program, a total of 713 trainees graduated the Thai and English Training. In May 2024, 120 participants joined Thai Language training (58 males, 59 females, and 3 LGBT) and 28 students have successfully graduated in English language training batch-7 (14 males, and 14 females).



HUMAN RIGHTS PROGRAM Total Beneficiaries 34

The program had weekly coordination meetings with three local CSO partners. The partner CSOs began training on human rights awareness, gender-based violence, landmines, and HRD dialogues. Since the start of the project from Feb 2023 to May 2024, a total of 814 participants (316 men, 457 women, 38 LGBT) joined the trainings on human rights knowledge and a total of 695 participants (273 men, 386 women, 36 LGBT) joined the trainings on personal data and digital security.
