



Program Overview

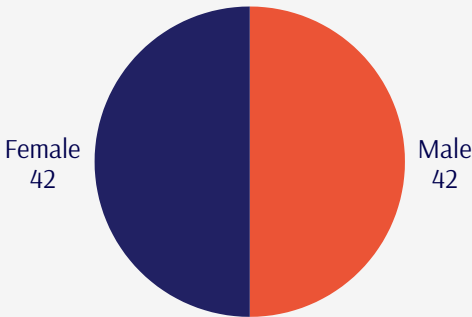
The NMF strives to offer humanitarian support to human rights advocates, democracy supporters, refugees, and marginalized communities inside and outside of the country. The efforts encompass supplying resources like food, shelter, financial aid, and medical care, alongside vocational and language training programs. Additionally, the NMF aids Burmese migrant communities by partnering with various stakeholders in Mae Sot.

Key Highlights

- On June 12th, NMF’s Human Rights Program issued a statement in observance of the World Day Against Child Labor.
- On June 19th, NMF participated in the Humanitarian Assistance Network (HAN) meeting led by Dr. Cynthia Maung. On the same day, NMF welcomed staff from Trócaire to its office and agricultural farm. Additionally, NMF commemorated Daw Aung San Suu Kyi’s 80th birthday at its safehouse together with residents and nearby communities.
- On June 20th, NMF’s Human Rights Program issued a statement in recognition of World Refugee Day.
- On June 23rd, NMF hosted a visit from a team leader of VOICE, supporting networks of survivors of conflict-related sexual violence (CRSV). NMF also welcomed a delegation from Borderless Japan, including three staff members from Red Dragon Company, to discuss promoting business and job opportunities for migrant communities.
- On June 26th, NMF’s Human Rights Program released a statement for the United Nations International Day in Support of Victims of Torture. On the same day, the program also released a statement for the International Day Against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking.
- Throughout June, NMF conducted its monthly program review meetings to enhance the effectiveness of upcoming activities.

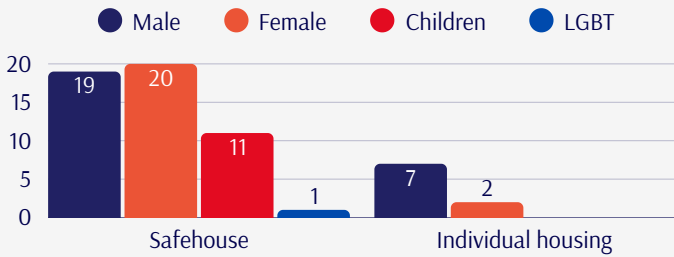
1.Basic Food Program

With the support of the donors, NMF provided emergency food to a total of 84 Burmese individuals comprising of 42 males and 42 females. Since February 2022, it has provided food of 55,530 units (One-month units) to 32,392 individuals.



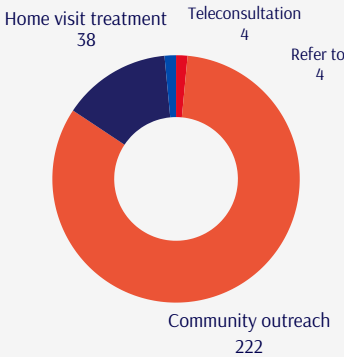
2. Safehouse Program

In June, NMF provided shelter assistance to 51 newly admitted refugees while 3 families (comprising of 9 individuals) with special needs were accommodated in individual housing. This program also supports job facilitation, medical service and vocational trainings. Since April 2021, NMF’s safe houses program contributed to a total of 2,632 individuals with shelter assistance.



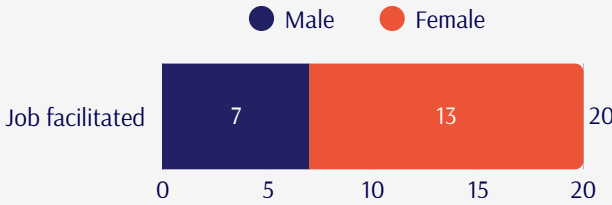
3. Community Health Program

The program treated 268 patients in June 2025. Since June 2022, NMF’s telehealth program has provided free healthcare services to 5,461 Burmese in Mae Sot, which cover 1428 males (26%), 3009 females (55%) and 1024 children (19%).



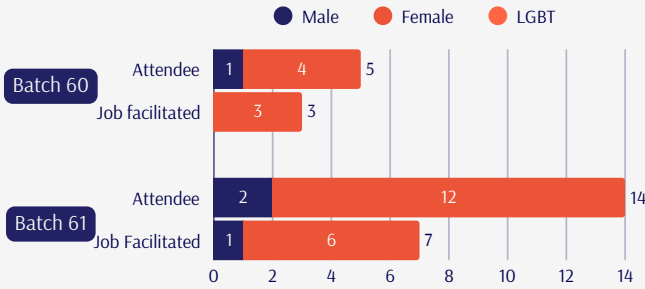
4. Job Facilitation Program

In June, 20 individuals (7 men and 13 women) were supported in finding employment in sewing industries, construction sites and agricultural farms. Since the program began, a total of 740 people have been assisted in securing jobs, including 330 men, 407 women, and 3 LGBT individuals.



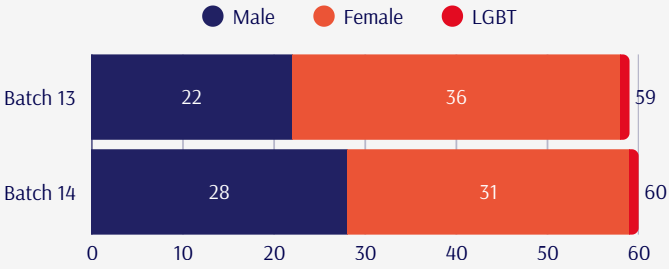
5. Sewing Machine Training

In June, industrial sewing trainings Batch (60) and (61) are delivered to a total of 19 trainees (16 females and 3 male). Since February 2022, there are a total of 61 sewing machine trainings with 612 trainees where 400 got jobs.



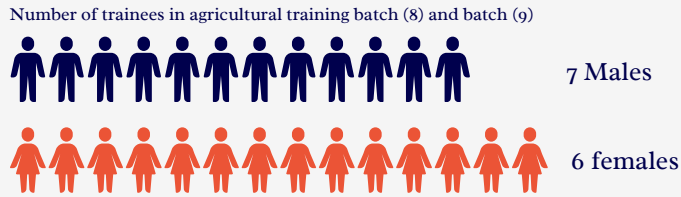
6. Thai Language Training

Thai language training batch-12, which commenced in April, was delivered to 60 participants (20 males and 39 females and 1 LGBTs) and a total of 28 participants finished the training (17 males and 11 females). Moreover, another batch (13) and (14) was commenced in May and June 2025. with a total of 119 participants (50 males, 67 females and 2 LGBTs). Since March 2022, a total of 520 trainees graduated the Thai language training.



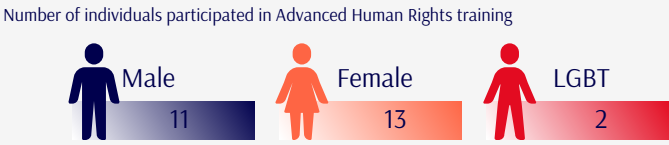
7. Agricultural Training Program

In June, agricultural training batch-8 and batch-9 were conducted for 26 participants (12 males and 14 females). The trainees cultivated on a 6-rai plot, growing crops, and were distributed to communities residing in boarding schools, Mae Tao clinic, safehouses and around Maesot. Since October 2024, a total of 9 agricultural training sessions have been held with 87 trainees.



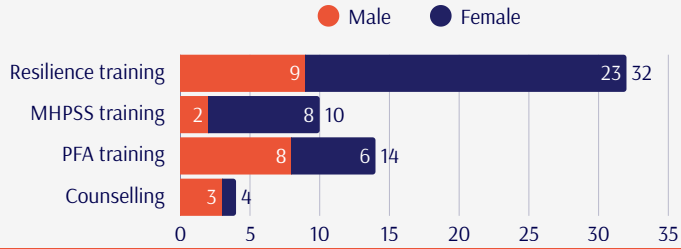
8. Human Rights Program

Partner CSOs, with NMF, conducted advocacy, including Women Lead Resource Centre’s one dialogue session and HRD conducted one human rights training session in June. Advanced human rights training was conducted for 26 participants. Since its commencement in Feb 2023, with the support of the donor, a total of 799 participants, a total of 819 participants, a total of 287 participants and a total of 191 participants have joined human rights training, personal data and digital security training, advanced human rights training and documentation training respectively.



9. MHPSS Program

The program provides counseling to 4 clients, resilience training to 32 individuals, Psychological First Aid (PFA) training to 14 participants, and Mental Health and Psychosocial Support (MHPSS) training to another 10 individuals. Since its commencement in April 2025, a total of 170 individuals were provided with mental health services.



10. Basic Computer Training

Two trainings were delivered to 19 participants including 13 males and 6 females in June. Since its commencement in April 2025, a total of 49 individuals were provided with basic computer training.
