



Program Overview

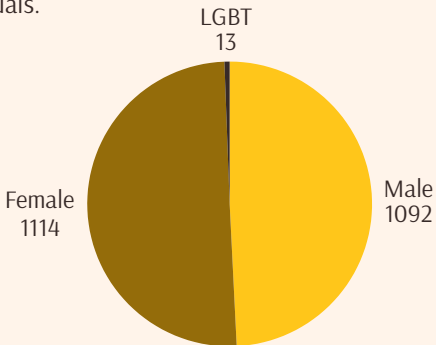
The NMF strives to offer humanitarian support to human rights advocates, democracy supporters, refugees, and marginalized communities inside and outside of the country. The efforts encompass supplying resources like food, shelter, financial aid, and medical care, alongside vocational and language training programs. Additionally, the NMF aids Burmese migrant communities by partnering with various stakeholders in Mae Sot.

Key Highlights

- On July 4th, NMF hosted a visit from the ICRC delegation to exchange views and analyses on the evolving developments in Myanmar.
- On July 4, New Myanmar Foundation issued two appeal letters to the international community: one urging it to stop the military regime's airstrikes against its own people, which are killing innocent civilians, including children; and another calling for the denunciation of the sham election.
- On July 11, NMF's Human Rights Program issued a statement addressing the military junta's aerial attacks on the monastery in Lintalu village, Sagaing Township.
- On July 17th, the NMF-HR program released an official statement in recognition of "World Day for International Justice".
- On July 19th, NMF held a commemoration of the 78th Martyrs' Day at the NMF safehouse.
- On July 22 and 23, NMF's HR Program held the launching ceremony for the Human Rights Documentation Annual Report 2024.
- On July 23, the NMF-HR program issued an official statement in response to the military junta's aerial assault on villages in the eastern part of Wetlet Township, Sagaing Region.
- On 20th July, NMF's basic food program provided emergency food support to a total of 60 school children (16 boys and 44 girls) at a IDP school in the border area.
- NMF newly launched livestock and agricultural project in this month.
- With the support of the donors, from 24th July to 4th of August, NMF distributed food packages to 2,357 people affected by flooding around Mae Sot, caused by Wipha Storm.

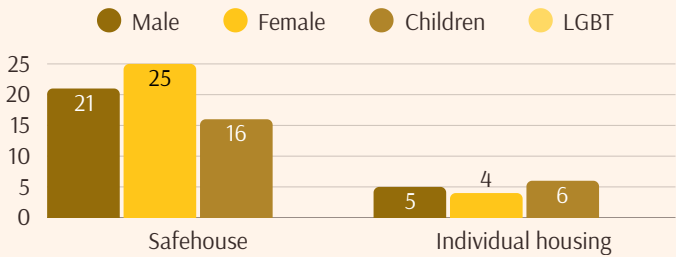
1. Basic Food Program

With the support of the donors, NMF provided emergency food to a total of 2219 Burmese individuals comprising of 1092 males ,1114 females and 13 LGBTs. Since February 2022, it has provided food of 59,781 units (One-month units) to 34,611 individuals.



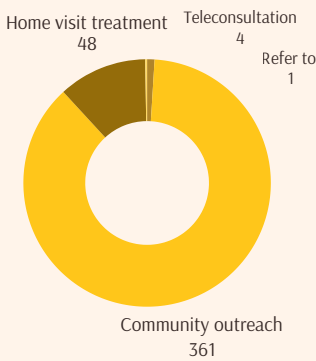
2. Safehouse Program

In July, NMF provided shelter assistance to 62 newly admitted refugees while 4 families (comprising of 15 individuals) with special needs were accommodated in individual housing. This program also supports job facilitation, medical service and vocational trainings. Since April 2021, NMF's safe houses program contributed to a total of 2,709 individuals with shelter assistance.



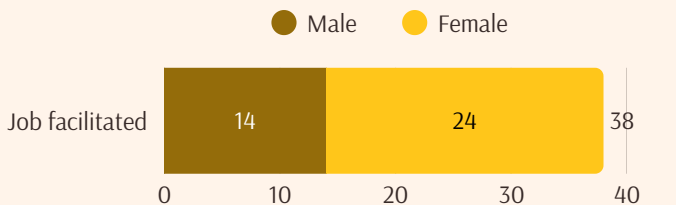
3. Community Health Program

The program treated 414 patients in July 2025. Since June 2022, NMF's telehealth program has provided free healthcare services to 5,875 Burmese in Mae Sot, which cover 1500 males (26%), 3265 females (55%) and 1110 children (19%).



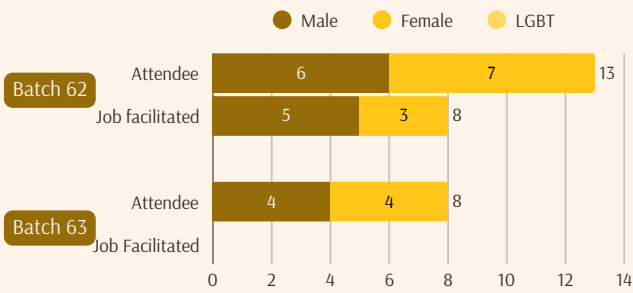
4. Job Facilitation Program

In July, 38 individuals (14 men and 24 women) were supported in finding employment in sewing industries, construction sites and agricultural farms. Since the program began, a total of 778 people has been assisted in securing jobs, including 344 men, 431 women, and 3 LGBT individuals.



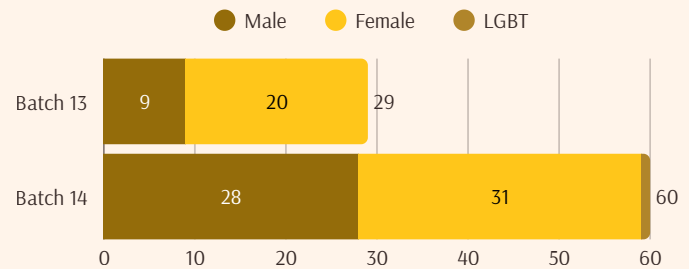
5. Sewing Machine Training

In July, industrial sewing trainings Batch (62) and (63) are delivered to a total of 21 trainees (11 females and 10 male). Since February 2022, there are a total of 63 sewing machine trainings with 633 trainees where 408 got jobs.



6. Thai Language Training

Thai language training batch-13, which commenced in May, was delivered to 59 participants (22 males and 36 females and 1 LGBTs) and a total of 29 participants finished the training (9 males and 20 females). Moreover, another batch (14) was commenced in July with a total of 60 participants (28 males, 31 females and 1 LGBT). Since March 2022, a total of 549 trainees graduated the Thai language training.



7. Agricultural Training Program

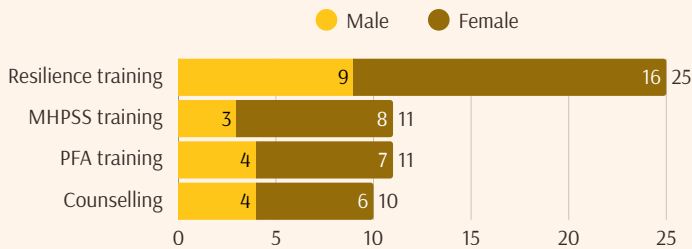
In July, agricultural training batch-10 was conducted for 13 participants (9 males and 4 females). The trainees cultivated on a 6-rai plot, growing crops, and were distributed to communities residing in boarding schools, Mae Tao clinic, safehouses and around Maesot. Since October 2024, a total of 10 agricultural training sessions has been held with 100 trainees.

9. MHPSS Program

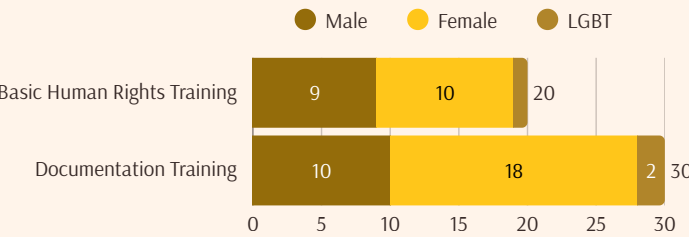
The program provides counseling to 10 clients, resilience training to 25 individuals, Psychological First Aid (PFA) training to 11 participants, and Mental Health and Psychosocial Support (MHPSS) training to another 11 individuals. Since its commencement in April 2025, a total of 228 individuals were provided with mental health services.



8. Human Rights Program

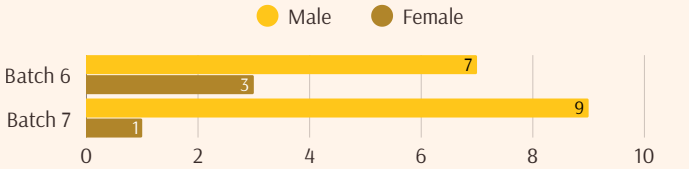
In July, partner CSOs, with NMF, conducted advocacy, including Women Lead Resource Centre's one dialogue session and HRD conducted Basic human rights and documentation trainings for 50 participants. Since its commencement in Feb 2023, with the support of the donor, a total of 820 participants, a total of 819 participants, a total of 287 participants and a total of 221 participants have joined human rights training, personal data and digital security training, advanced human rights training and documentation training respectively.

10. Basic Computer Training

Two trainings were delivered to 20 participants including 16 males and 4 females in July. Since its commencement in April 2025, a total of 55 individuals were provided with basic computer training.
