

Program Overview

August - 2025

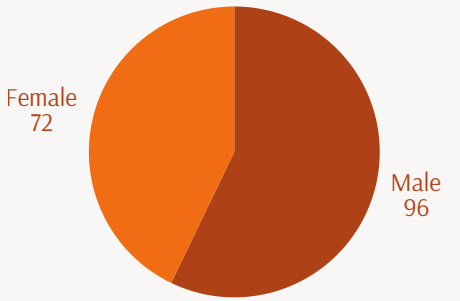
The NMF strives to offer humanitarian support to human rights advocates, democracy supporters, refugees, and marginalized communities inside and outside of the country. The efforts encompass supplying resources like food, shelter, financial aid, and medical care, alongside vocational and language training programs. Additionally, the NMF aids Burmese migrant communities by partnering with various stakeholders in Mae Sot.

Highlight

- On August 1st, the New Myanmar Foundation (NMF) welcomed 8 representatives from Borderless Japan.
- On August 8th, NMF released a statement on the 8888 anniversary and hosted a commemorative event at the NMF safehouse.
- On August 12th, NMF participated in International Youth Day hosted by SPACE.
- On August 18th, NMF's Human Rights Program issued an official statement addressing the military junta's two separate aerial attacks on a local hospital and civilian residential areas in Lokar Village, Mawchi, Karenni State.
- On August 19th, NMF hosted the visit of CWS's Regional Program Manager regarding the implementation of the livestock program.
- On August 26th, NMF's Human Rights Program issued an official statement in response to the military junta's aerial assault on civilian residences in Dai-Kyi Ward, Maruk-U Township, Rakhine State.
- To foster program improvements, NMF also conducted its monthly program review meetings during August.

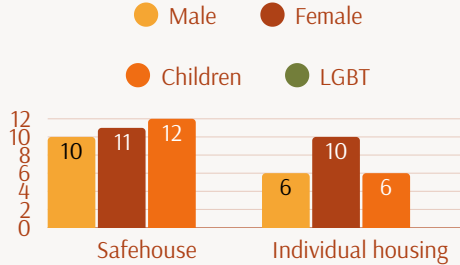
Basic Food Program

With the support of the donors, NMF provided emergency food to a total of 168 Burmese individuals comprising of 96 males and 72 females. Since February 2022, it has provided food of 60,552 units (One-month units) to 35,538 individuals.



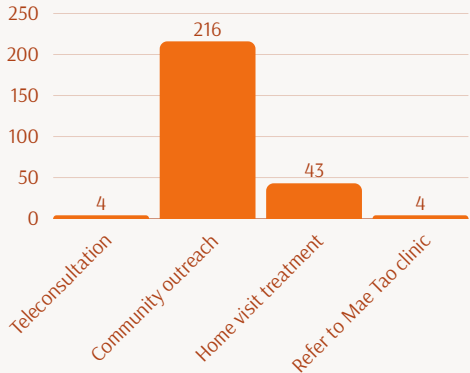
Safehouse Program

In August, NMF provided shelter assistance to 33 newly admitted refugees while 4 families (comprising of 22 individuals) with special needs were accommodated in individual housing. This program also supports job facilitation, medical service and vocational trainings. Since April 2021, NMF's safe houses program contributed to a total of 2,764 individuals with shelter assistance.



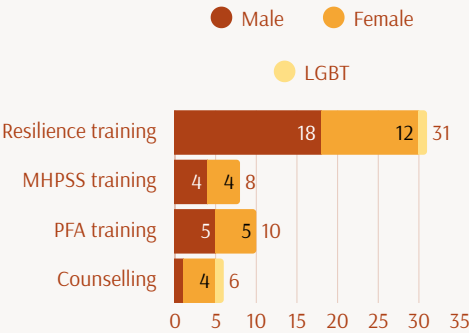
Community Health Program

The program treated 267 patients in August 2025. Since June 2022, NMF's telehealth program has provided free healthcare services to 6,142 Burmese in Mae Sot, which cover 1567 males (26%), 3423 females (55%) and 1152 children (19%).



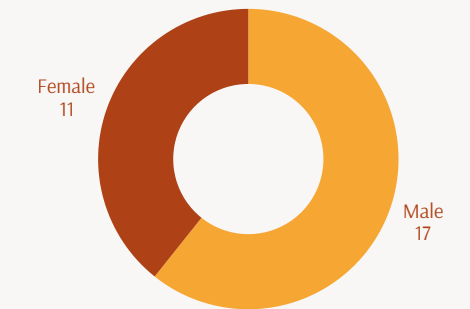
MHPSS Program

The program provides counseling to 6 clients, resilience training to 31 individuals, Psychological First Aid (PFA) training to 10 participants, and Mental Health and Psychosocial Support (MHPSS) training to another 8 individuals. Since its commencement in April 2025, a total of 283 individuals were provided with mental health services.



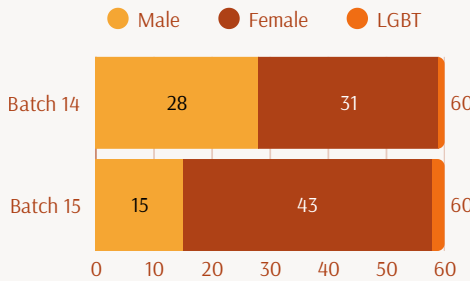
Job Facilitation Program

In August, 28 individuals (17 men and 11 women) were supported in finding employment in sewing industries, construction sites and agricultural farms. Since the program began, a total of 806 people has been assisted in securing jobs, including 361 men, 442 women, and 3 LGBT individuals.



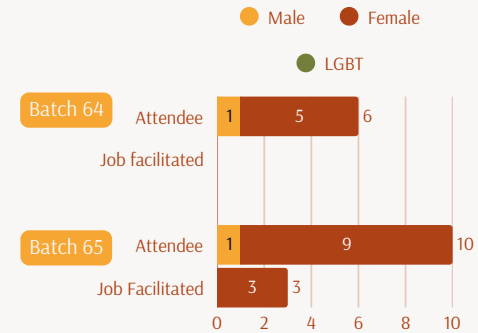
Thai Language Training

Thai language training batch-14, which commenced in July, was delivered to 60 participants (28 males and 31 females and 1 LGBTs) and another batch-15 was commenced in August with a total of 60 participants (15 males, 43 females and 2 LGBTs). Since March 2022, a total of 549 trainees graduated the Thai language training.



Sewing Machine Training

In August, industrial sewing trainings Batch (64) and (65) are delivered to a total of 16 trainees (14 females and 2 males). Since February 2022, there are a total of 65 sewing machine trainings with 649 trainees where 411 got jobs.



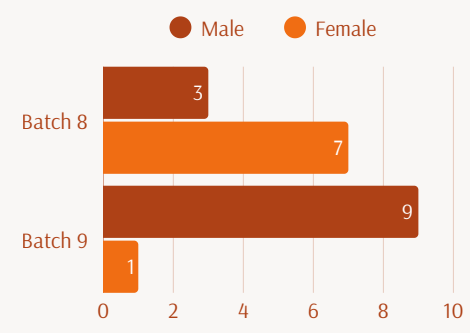
Agricultural Training

In August, agricultural training batch-11 was conducted for 13 participants (8 males and 5 females). The trainees cultivated on a 6-rai plot, growing crops, and were distributed to communities residing in boarding schools, Mae Tao clinic, safehouses and around Maesot. Since October 2024, a total of 11 agricultural training sessions has been held with 113 trainees.



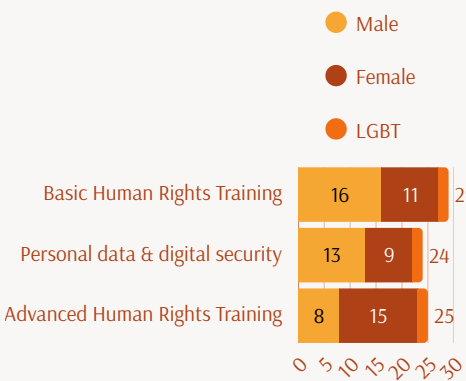
Basic Computer Training

Two trainings were delivered to 20 participants including 12 males and 8 females in August. Since its commencement in April 2025, a total of 74 individuals were provided with basic computer training.



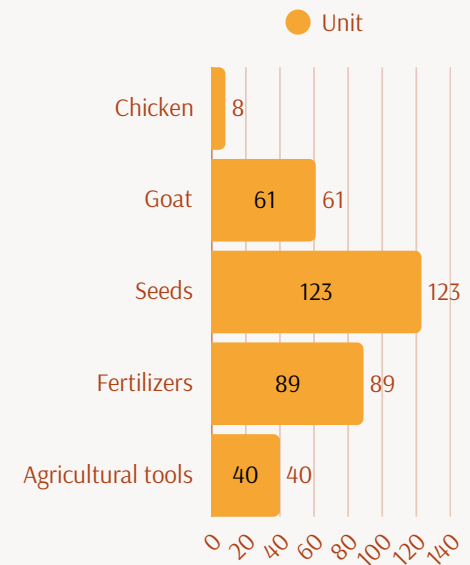
Human Rights Program

In August, partner CSOs, with NMF, conducted advocacy, including three on-line dialogue sessions. Additionally, the program conducted Basic human rights, advanced human rights and documentation trainings for 78 participants. Since its commencement in Feb 2023, with the support of the donor, a total of 847 participants, a total of 861 participants, a total of 312 participants and a total of 221 participants have joined human rights training, personal data and digital security training, advanced human rights training and documentation training respectively.



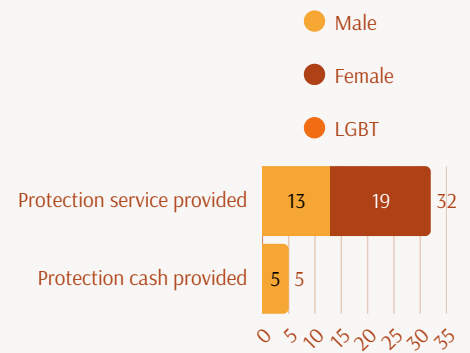
Livestock Program

In August, a total of 8 chickens, 61 goats, 40 agricultural tools, 123 seed packages, and 89 bags of fertilizer were provided to 292 individuals to support small-scale agriculture and animal husbandry in Mae Sot. The program, which commenced in July 2025, has supported 292 beneficiaries with agricultural tools and livestock.



Protection Program

The program commenced in April 2025, providing protection service to 4 cases (comprising of 32 beneficiaries, 13 males and 19 females). Additionally, the program support protection cash support to five male individuals.
