

Program Overview

September - 2025

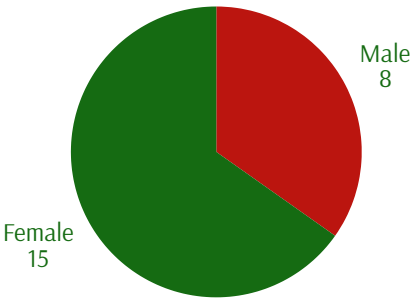
The NMF strives to offer humanitarian support to human rights advocates, democracy supporters, refugees, and marginalized communities inside and outside of the country. The efforts encompass supplying resources like food, shelter, financial aid, and medical care, alongside vocational and language training programs. Additionally, the NMF aids Burmese migrant communities by partnering with various stakeholders in Mae Sot.

Highlight

- On September 10, the New Myanmar Foundation issued a statement and organized a prayer session for Daw Aung San Suu Kyi. An appeal letter was also distributed to diplomats and senior leaders of international NGOs. The prayer session was held with safehouse residents on September 12.
- On September 14, NMF released an appeal letter addressed to the international community, condemning the airstrike in Kyauktaw Township that killed 22 teenage students.
- On September 16, NMF held an online meeting with a representative from StARS (Refugee Service Organization) in Cairo to explore potential areas of collaboration.
- On September 25, the Executive Director of NMF attended the third quarterly meeting of the Anti-Trafficking Network hosted by the IOM.
- On September 30, NMF participated in an online presentation by ANFREL regarding the military regime's proposed general elections.
- Throughout September, NMF also visited schools in Phop Phra Township that were in need of support and sent an appeal letter to international donors requesting funding assistance.

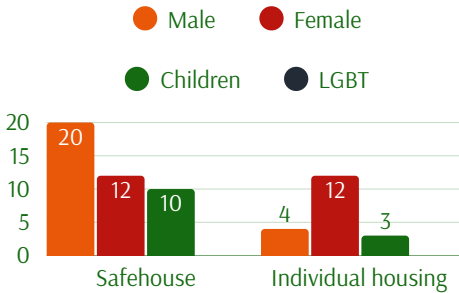
Basic Food Program

With the support of the donors, NMF provided emergency food to a total of 23 Burmese individuals comprising 8 males and 15 females. Since February 2022, it has provided food of 60,575 units (One-month units) to 34,802 individuals.



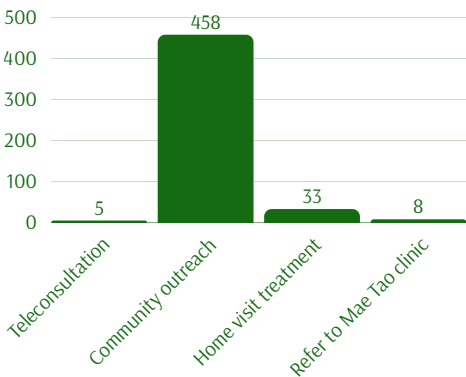
Safehouse Program

In September, NMF provided shelter assistance to 42 newly admitted refugees while 19 individuals with special needs were accommodated in individual housing. This program also supports job facilitation, medical service and vocational trainings. Since April 2021, NMF's safe houses program contributed to a total of 2,825 individuals with shelter assistance.



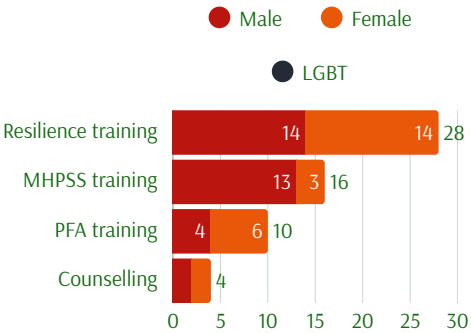
Community Health Program

The program treated 504 patients in September 2025. Since June 2022, NMF's telehealth program has provided free healthcare services to 6,646 Burmese in Mae Sot, which cover 1652 males (25%), 3716 females (56%) and 1278 children (19%).



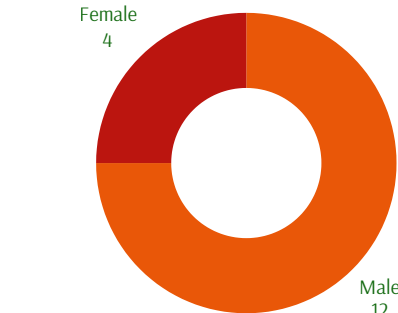
MHPSS Program

The program provides counseling to 4 clients, resilience training to 28 individuals, Psychological First Aid (PFA) training to 10 participants, and Mental Health and Psychosocial Support (MHPSS) training to another 16 individuals. Since its commencement in April 2025, a total of 341 individuals were provided with mental health services.



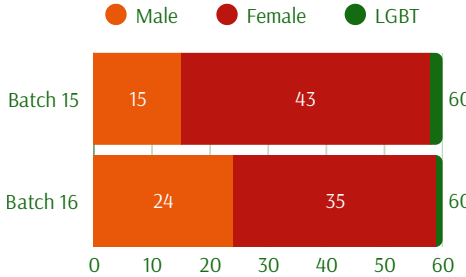
Job Facilitation Program

In September, 16 individuals (12 men and 4 women) were supported in finding employment in sewing industries, construction sites and agricultural farms. Since the program began, a total of 822 people has been assisted in securing jobs, including 373 men, 446 women, and 3 LGBT individuals.



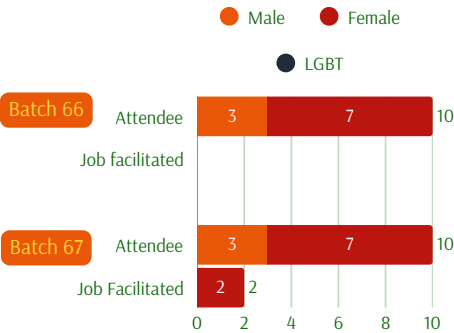
Thai Language Training

Thai language training batch-15, which commenced in August, was delivered to 60 participants (15 males and 43 females and 2 LGBTs) and another batch-16 was commenced in October with a total of 60 participants (24 males, 35 females and 1 LGBTs). Since March 2022, a total of 585 trainees graduated the Thai language training.



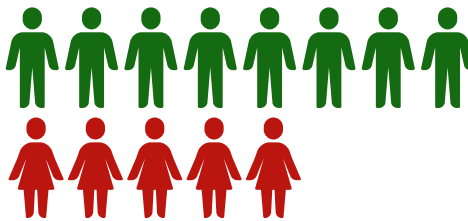
Sewing Machine Training

In September, industrial sewing trainings Batch (66) and (67) are delivered to a total of 20 trainees (14 females and 6 males). Since February 2022, there are a total of 67 sewing machine trainings with 669 trainees where 413 got jobs.



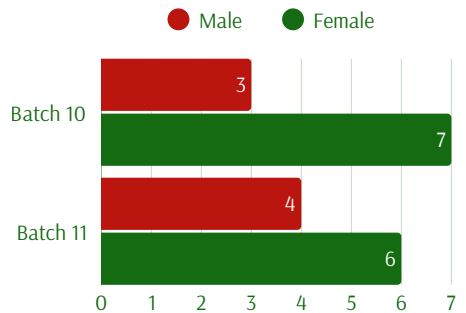
Agricultural Training

In September, agricultural training batch-12 was conducted for 13 participants (8 males and 5 females). The trainees cultivated on a 6-rai plot, growing crops, and were distributed to communities residing in boarding schools, Mae Tao clinic, safehouses and around Maesot. Since October 2024, a total of 12 agricultural training sessions has been held with 126 trainees.



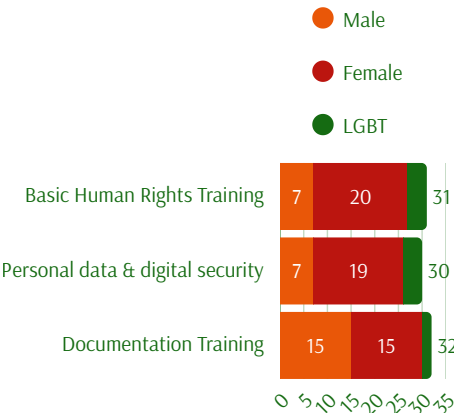
Basic Computer Training

Two trainings were delivered to 20 participants including 7 males and 13 females in September. Since its commencement in April 2025, a total of 94 individuals were provided with basic computer training.



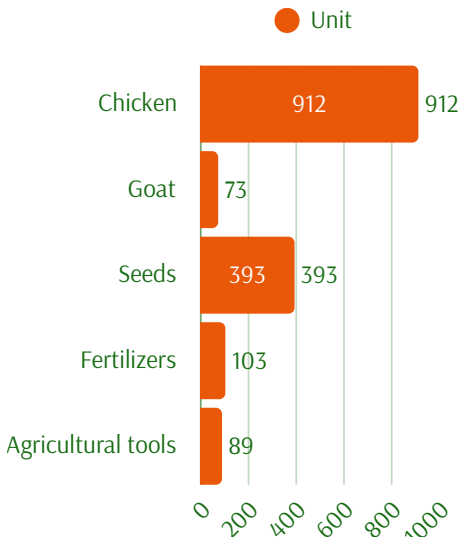
Human Rights Program

In September, partner CSOs, with NMF, conducted advocacy, including one on-line dialogue sessions. Additionally, the program conducted Basic human rights, digital security and documentation trainings for 93 participants. Since its commencement in Feb 2023, with the support of the donor, a total of 878 participants, a total of 891 participants, a total of 312 participants and a total of 253 participants have joined human rights training, personal data and digital security training, advanced human rights training and documentation training respectively.



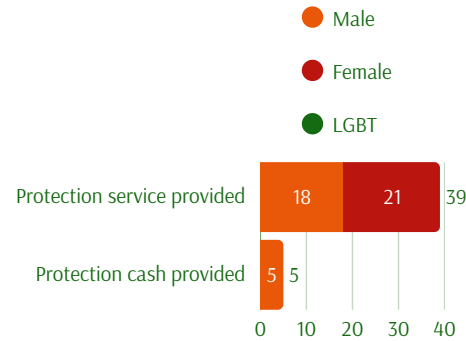
Livestock Program

In September, a total of 912 chickens, 73 goats, 89 agricultural tools, 393 seed packages, and 103 bags of fertilizer were provided to 1030 individuals (281 households) to support small-scale agriculture and animal husbandry in Mae Sot. The program, which commenced in July 2025, has supported 1322 beneficiaries with agricultural tools and livestock.



Protection Program

The program commenced in April 2025, providing protection service to 7 cases (comprising 39 beneficiaries, 18 males and 21 females). Additionally, the program support protection cash support to five male individuals.
